


WHO IS SOUTH AFRICAN **WOMEN IN PLUMBLING?**

We facilitate, with implementing partners, value added services to beneficiaries, such as financial planning and insurance products.

Funded by Ceramic Industries, SAWIP embarked on a mission to uplift the community after the devastating effects the COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown had on our countries rate of unemployment.

In 2021 from June to November SAWIP successfully trained 30 FLC (Foundation Learning Competency) students which is Gap training required as a minimum qualification for ARPL (Artisan Recognition of Prior Learning) and 45 Plumbers hand students which is Basic upskill plumbing program for unqualified plumbing labourers' to allow them the opportunity to enter the Plumbing trade with experience and stand out from other candidates.


